## Prebbleton's First Doctor: William Henry SYMES

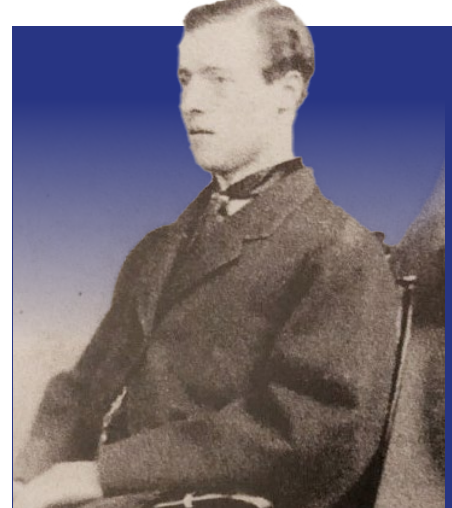

With the construction of our second medical centre underway we thought it timely to have a look at our early medical residents.

William Henry SYMES, born in England 1843, was the first doctor to reside in Prebbleton. He was an extremely well qualified doctor, first graduating with BSc in Paris 1861 then qualifying as MD at Edinburgh University in 1866. He joined the Royal Navy and was appointed Assistant Surgeon on board the HMS Galatea, which was commanded by HRH Prince Alfred, Duke of Edinburgh, Queen Victoria's second eldest son. In 1868, the Galatea visited several countries including Australia and New Zealand. While in Sydney, the Prince was shot in an assassination attempt by Henry O'Farrell. Symes provided immediate assistance and later extracted the bullet with the Prince making a full recovery. O'Farrell was hanged for this treasonous act soon after. Symes had been impressed on his visit to New Zealand and when discharged from the Navy, returned to NZ on the Charlotte Gladstone in February 1872.

Daphne McAven transcribed part of his diary, which is held at the Alexander Turnbull Library, covering his time in Prebbleton. In it he records that he spent his first few months staying at various homes in Christchurch and locally before coming to stay at the All Saints' Vicarage with the Rev. W.E Paige in April 1872. By May he had moved into a cottage and writes of "Blake setting up my dispensary", "unpacking and sweeping the chimney with Hazelhurst," and "Mrs Jones scrubbed out the cottage." In December 1872 he made a purchase of land on Springs Road around the area of present day numbers 524/526 opposite the shops. He went on to purchase other parcels of land both on Springs Road and Norris Street, but we believe his residence and dispensary

## Councillor Chat – Cr Sarah Barnsley

There has been very little opportunity to pause and reflect on the first quarter of the triennium, as we continue into autumn at pace. Every day has brought stimulation, challenge, learning and enjoyment, regardless of the task at hand.

Our summer reading was a little different to the usual thriller novel this year - although not without suspense - as we worked through the latest Local Government Reform proposals and reviewed every project, service and activity in the upcoming Annual Plan. While we already know “who’s done it”, our role was to understand what these reforms could mean for Selwyn communities and for council operations. This allowed us to help formulate robust submissions to Central Government that clearly communicated where improvements to the reforms were needed. The final chapters are still being written, and more clarity will emerge over these significant changes over the coming months.

A structured prioritisation process for the Annual Plan review proved incredibly useful. It enabled a thorough investigation of the budget, careful examination of spending, and identification of potential cost saving opportunities. By the time we returned in January, councillors and staff were ready to interrogate each budget line: its purpose, expected outcomes, community impact, and whether savings might be achieved by pausing, reducing, or continuing work. An important part of this process was connecting the numbers with the real world impact of every decision.

Initial modelling has produced a first draft rates increase of around 6–7% for 2026/27, down from the earlier forecast of 13.3%. Councillors have asked staff to dig deeper and identify further savings. We are also awaiting confirmation of the Selwyn Water Limited component of the rates equation. Establishing SWL comes with higher initial costs and mid term financial gains (as early forecasts have shown). The final figure for the next financial year depends on confirming its balance sheet - an extensive water asset valuation and reconciliation project - and its profit and loss, which relies on improved data systems for more accurate water measurement and charging. Achieving robust accuracy and accountability is complex but essential, and it is the reassurance our community deserves.

Council will adopt the Draft Annual Plan on **11 March**, and public consultation opens **16 March** for six weeks. This is your plan, and we encourage you to share your views. Information and submission options will be available on the SDC website, the Selwyn Times, local Facebook pages and in the April issue of Prebbleton Life. Please look out for these.

Notifications of the new Primary School proposal off Hamptons Rd, road safety along Springs Road, a Community Facility, Kā Kaha Park Stage 2, and future traffic flows through and around Prebbleton village are all projects, challenges and opportunities being discussed and progressed over the coming months. These sit alongside wider work underway for Spatial Planning (think long term growth, zoning, traffic, reserves and infrastructure planning) and early thinking for the 2027–2037 Long Term Plan.

Supporting the Prebbleton Community Association, and the work it does for our community, is a very enjoyable part of the role. Alongside other conversations, we are working with the committee to consider options for stronger community representation at council and to progress the Prebbleton Community Facility. I encourage the community, through the PCA, to begin forming a strong and coordinated stakeholder voice for this facility. Clear, organised and early community input will help ensure the project truly reflects local needs now and into the future. I, along with my fellow Kā Puna Springs and At Large Councillors, look forward to supporting you in this process.

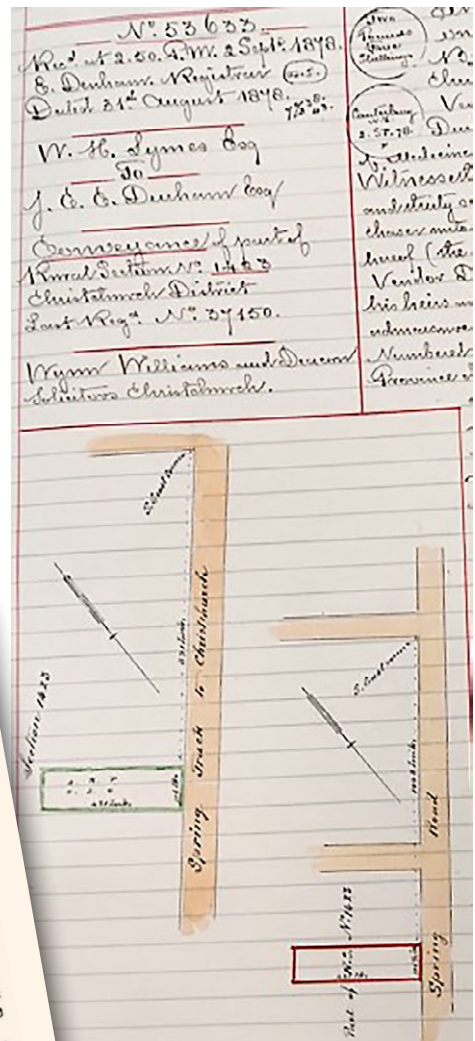
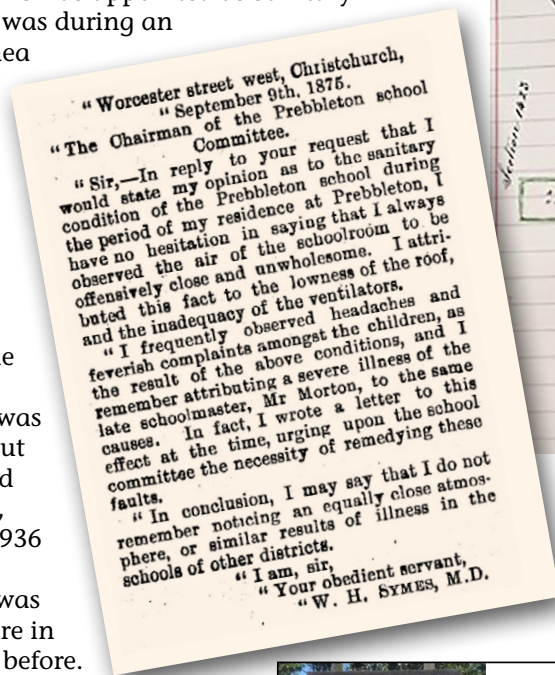
were on Springs Road. He records his travels around the district and further afield making house calls and travelling into Christchurch on numerous occasions. His horse Warrior seems to have been his main mode of transport, with a stable being built in August. He noted that All Saints' Church was opened on 21 July 1872. The church was later consecrated on 1st November, but his diary unfortunately finishes in October 1872. Symes married Elizabeth Marion PARK in Wellington in February 1878 giving his residence as Christchurch. He had purchased a house on the corner of Worcester St and Cambridge Tce (now the site of the Harley Buildings), indicating he had left Prebbleton by this time. In September that year he sold his land on Springs Road to his successor, Dr John Durham, who we will write about next month.

William and Elizabeth had three children, sons Langford and Robert and daughter, Marion.

He was a member of the Philosophical Institute, as was Julius von Haast and John Macmillan Brown with whom he had a long friendship. He became the Police Medical Officer in 1899, conducting postmortems and giving evidence in court and in 1900 he was appointed as Sanitary Commissioner for Christchurch. This was during an

outbreak of bubonic plague in Noumea with the risk of it reaching NZ and he was responsible for setting up the necessary quarantine facilities if they were needed.

He is listed at his Worcester Street residence for several years but in 1921 he made a trip with Macmillan Brown to the Pacific to pursue his interest in tropical diseases. This led to him returning to Brisbane where he spent the next few years researching tropical diseases and hookworm. He was intending to return to Christchurch but died on 10 April 1928 in Brisbane and was buried in the Toowong Cemetery, Brisbane. His wife Elizabeth died in 1936 and is buried at Waimairi Cemetery. Although Symes' time in Prebbleton was short he provided the first medical care in the town where there had been none before.

## Prebbleton School

We've had a fantastic start to 2026 here at Prebbleton School, with lots of activities underway to kick off the new year.

One exciting development is the commencement of construction on our new covered outdoor learning area (COLA), which we are all eager to see completed and ready for use.

You will have noticed the upgrade to our school crossing, which now features a marked zebra crossing. This provides a safe crossing point outside of the times when our road patrol is operating. We want to clarify the procedures, as some drivers have been unsure how to proceed when the school patrol is active versus when it is a regular pedestrian crossing:

- **When the road patrol is operating (signs are down):** This is a school patrol crossing. Cars must stop when the orange 'Stop' signs are extended. If you stop when the signs are not extended, the supervisor will likely wave you through.
- **When the road patrol signs are folded away:** The crossing functions as a regular pedestrian crossing. Vehicles must stop and allow pedestrians to cross.

Finally, a reminder that the speed limit outside the school is **30 km/h** during the busy morning and afternoon drop-off and pick-up times.

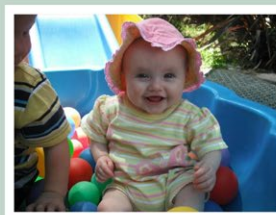

# Pancake Recipe

As we head towards Easter I wonder how many people made pancakes on Tuesday 17 February, colloquially called Pancake Tuesday but its actual name is Shrove Tuesday. Traditionally, it's the day on which perishable food was eaten prior to the period of Lent, a forty-day period leading up to Easter Sunday.

Recently, I have come across a recipe from Eating Bird Food which I have adapted slightly to our taste. You might like to try these high protein pancakes.

## INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 cup of organic wholemeal spelt flour
- 1tsp baking powder
- A good dose of organic ground cinnamon
- 2 large free-range eggs (I have used 4 bantam eggs)
- A good splash of organic vanilla extract
- A 250g tub of full-fat cottage cheese
- A tbsp of organic maple syrup
- Light olive oil

## METHOD

Mix flour, baking powder and cinnamon in a bowl then add the remaining ingredients. Mix well - I use a metal spoon. If you leave the mixture for 30 minutes or so it gives the mixture chance to combine well. It will even keep, covered, for 48 hours in the fridge. Heat oil on a medium heat in a large non-stick frying pan which has a flat surface. I heat on level 6 ex 10 of an induction hob. Once the oil is heated, add tablespoons of batter and fry until craters appear on the surface of the pancakes, usually about 5 or 6 minutes. Flip and fry for a further 2 minutes or so.

## SERVING

I prefer lemon juice, organic maple syrup, fruit and organic Greek-style natural yogurt.

Go-Kart Racer and Prebbleton Local



**What's been your proudest racing moment so far?**

Answer: Definitely my recent win of the FIA Arrive and Drive World Cup in Malaysia.

**Who inspires you in motorsport?**

Answer: Shane Van Gisbergen

**What's the hardest part of the sport for you?**

Answer: The challenge of being consistent every lap to give you an edge over the other drivers.

**What advice would you give to other young people who want to try go-karting?**

Answer: Just to do as many laps as you can and practice in all conditions.

**What are your future goals in motorsport?**

Answer: My 2026 goal is to podium in the Australian Karting Championship. Win the 2026 Rok SV class so I can have an opportunity to race in the USA at the end of the year. My ultimate goal is to have a career in some form of Motorsport.

Prebbleton Life recently caught up with Prebbleton local, Zach Tucker, who won the first ever FIA Karting Arrive and Drive World Cup (Senior) after a dramatic finale held at the LYL International Circuit in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia.

**How did you first get into go-karting?**

Answer: I got a Go Kart for Christmas when I was Six years old, and I spent a lot of time at Kartsport Canterbury doing many many laps.
