Digital sign & Pedestrian Crossing – Springs Road

While there seems to be little we can do to stop the digital sign board (despite trying various avenues), I would like to acknowledge Mayor Lydia Gliddon and Acting CEO Steve Gibling for taking the time to meet and understand our community's concerns, and for the approval for Steve Guy and his team to work with us to improve the pedestrian crossing on Springs Road (thanks also to Steve Guy and his team). Pedestrian safety was the overwhelming issue that people raised when the concept of the digital sign was 'illuminated' to the community. I must also acknowledge the work of Jenny Adams and the group who led the petition for improvements to the Pedestrian crossing (prior to the sign). Jenny was meticulous in her analysis of the SDC's documentation and data for the crossing improvements, and while we published combined comms, Jenny also answered questions raised on social media and went back to SDC when more information was needed. Thanks, Jenny, for a very thorough job.

Prebbleton Profile: Callum Samson



Can you tell us a bit about your cricket journey so far—where did it all start?

My cricketing journey started when I was younger playing backyard cricket with my brother for hours every day.

Who or what has been the biggest influence on your development as a player?

I would say the biggest influence of my development so far as a player is my parents. My parents may not have taught me all the technical aspects of the game but they have certainly taught me the most important aspects of development, and a strong work ethic.

What position do you play, and what do you enjoy most about that role?

I am a bowling all rounder (left arm seamer) and a right hand batter.

How did it feel when you found out you'd been selected to represent New Zealand at the ICC Under-19 Cricket World Cup?

I would say it is up there with one of the best moments of my life because I have dedicated so much time to cricket and training, so it's nice to get the recognition.

What was the biggest challenge at the World Cup?

I would say the biggest challenge at the World Cup was definitely being in such a different country like Zimbabwe as there are so many aspects that are different especially the food. But overall, the experience outweighs everything. To travel to a country like Zimbabwe that I probably wouldn't have visited otherwise was so cool and to verse the best players in the world at my age.

Do you have any pre-game routines or superstitions?

I wouldn't say I have any superstitions but I do try and keep my routines the same before every game to try and get as much consistency in my performance as I can.

Who would you like to thank for supporting you along the way?

I would love to thank my parents because without them, none of this would've been possible. The hours that I have spent at the nets with them and the amount of times that they have taken me across town to my games, I am extremely grateful for.

How do you balance cricket with school/work and other commitments?

It certainly does get busy at times in the summer with university and cricket but it is nice to be busy and know that I am working hard and investing in my future.

What advice would you give to younger players in the community who dream of playing for New Zealand?

The one piece of advice I would give to younger players that are striving to play for New Zealand is to work as hard as you can but also to have fun along the way.

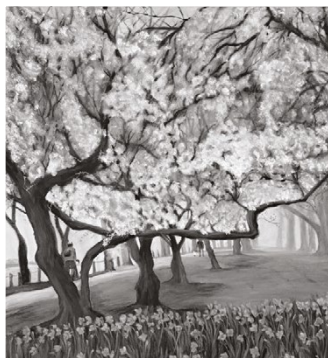

Prebbleton's Second Doctor: Dr John Charles Crozier DURHAM

Prebbleton's next doctor after William Symes, whom we covered last month, purchased the property used by Dr Symes in Springs Road, so the surgery continued without a break.

Dr John Charles Crozier Durham was born in Bombay, India in 1844. His father was serving for the East India Army as Deputy-Inspector-General of Hospitals. When John was nine, he was sent back home to Ireland for his education. He graduated in medicine at Trinity College, Dublin, then served briefly with the British Army in the West Indies.

He left the Army to become the ship's surgeon aboard the "Punjab," the first emigration vessel operated by the NZ Shipping Company, arriving at Lyttelton in September 1873. This was an inauspicious start to his career as an outbreak of measles and typhoid fever spread through the passengers, resulting in 28 deaths. The passengers were quarantined on Ripapa Island on arrival. Interestingly, a large portion of the immigrants were Danish, and 21 of the deaths were of Danish nationality. Some descendants of those Danish immigrants still live within the Selwyn district.

Dr Durham registered to practise at Akaroa in January 1874 but by December of that year arrived in Prebbleton to take over Dr Symes' practise. He married Annie FINLAY in January 1875, and a son was born in Prebbleton in May 1876.

It appears he practised until about 1880 before moving to Sydney, then served in Melbourne until 1896 as medical officer for the Victorian Military forces. In 1896 he shifted to South Africa and on the outbreak of the Boer War served as a medical officer for the Royal Army Medical Corps. He accompanied troops to quell the Zulu uprising in 1906, but contracted pneumonia.

He returned to New Zealand and resumed his medical practice in Prebbleton. His wife, Annie, died in 1908 and was buried in All Saints' Cemetery. In 1910 Dr Durham shifted to Stanmore Road but soon required hospital care, putting his continuing ill-health down to the pneumonia contracted in South Africa.

He died aged 63 in Christchurch Hospital in August 1910. His funeral was held at All Saints' Church by Rev John Russell Wilford and was buried alongside his wife.

He had remained closely connected to the Army during his brief return to Prebbleton and in 1909 presented a sword to the Canterbury Scouts Reserve Corps with the intention it be worn by the senior lieutenant during their term of office.

Throughout much of his adult life he chose to hyphenate his surname to "Crozier-Durham." The Crozier name was the surname of his mother and was given to him as one of his first names. His father, Andrew, was known only as Andrew Durham. John and Annie named their only child Crozier de Courcy Durham.

Crozier later served in the Australian forces in WW1 and was in the Australian landing party at Gaba Tepe, Gallipoli, on April 25, 1915. His commanding officer later reported: "Crozier Durham, one of the biggest men I have seen, and very powerfully made, spent the whole of the first three days walking from the dressing station on the beach to the firing line and carrying two wounded men back every journey. The whole trip had to be done under fire both going and coming." Crozier married in England whilst serving overseas and all three of his children were registered using the surname "Crozier-Durham."



John's elder brother, Samuel, was known only as Samuel Durham. Samuel trained as a Veterinary Surgeon in Scotland and emigrated to New Zealand in 1877. He lived with his brother for a time in Prebbleton, advertising his Veterinary services. Samuel also lived at Lincoln before moving to the North Island.

Prebbleton has had a long wait for the return of local medical services having been served by doctors from Lincoln and elsewhere for more than a century.

The burial service in the church and at the graveside was conducted by the Rev. J. R. Wilford, the masonic rites being performed by the Rev. A. I. Bernstein. Bugler Smith, of the Engineers, sounded the "Last Post" at the graveside.
